#### Student Planner

- Students are responsible for accurately recording assignments each day
- Parents should sign planner each night M-Th indicating that they have seen their child's completed homework if homework is incomplete, planner should not be signed
- Planner not signed and/or homework not completed results in a signature on the homework card
- May be used for quick communication between parents and teacher
- Tests/Quizzes/Due dates for the week are always written in red

#### Weekly Newsletter

- E-mailed, hard copy in weekly folder, and may be found on class web page
- Includes important dates within the classroom and campus wide
- Overview of academics for the week

## Weekly Folder

- Sent home every Monday
- Contains graded work/tests from previous week, newsletter, and other communication
- Number of papers below 75% indicated on signature sheet
- Please remove graded papers, sign on dated line, and return by Wednesday

#### **Missing/Late Work**

- Homework is due first thing in the morning
- If homework is not complete, students go to Opportunity Club during recess to complete the assignment; grade is automatically dropped to a maximum score of 65% per Valley Academy policy
- Homework card is signed
- Students that are absent have one day for each day they are absent to complete make-up work

#### **Book Reports**

- Students will choose a different type of fiction book (mystery, fantasy, adventure, etc.) each quarter
- Books must be on the school's recommended reading list for 5<sup>th</sup> grade or higher and approved by both parent and teacher
- Books for first quarter must be read and graphic organizer completed by September 8th
- 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Book report due on September 26<sup>th</sup>
- 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter will be historical fiction / 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter will be State Research Project / 4th quarter will be a Literary Analysis of an approved fiction book.

#### **Responsibility Cards**

- Missing/incomplete/left at home homework or unsigned planner results in signature on homework card
- Behavior issues result in signature on responsibility card
- Every 3 signatures on homework or responsibility card result in a detention (not combined)

## Grading Policies/ParentVue

- Generally anything with a percentage on it is recorded in the grade book
- Papers with incomplete headings lose 5%; no name loses 10%
- 1/2 off for misspelled words when a word bank is provided or they are common words
- Corrected study guides are turned in for homework grade (includes Saxon math test form A)
- Parents are encouraged to use ParentVue to stay informed about their child's grades

### Curriculum

- Spalding/Spelling
  - o Students are held accountable for neat and accurate Spalding notebooks
  - Students are tested on 40 new words and 10 review words per week
  - Spelling packets will be used each week received on Monday, due on Friday
- Language/Writing
  - Easy Grammar parts of speech, punctuation, types of sentences
  - o Grammar and Writing 5 writing skills for sentences, paragraphs, and essays
  - 6 Traits are emphasized for all types of writing
- Reading
  - o Using basal reader for Tall Tales, Legends, Folk Tales, and Mythology
  - Novel studies Johnny Tremain and Tuck Everlasting
  - o Analyze different types of literature and attributes of quality literature
  - Required reading of 600 pages per quarter books are not required to be from list
  - o Monthly memory piece recitation due by Thursday of the first full week of each month
- Math
  - o Timed fact tests monthly assessments count as assignment grade; quarterly as quiz grade
  - Saxon text with supplemental worksheets to meet state standards
  - o Buckle Down Math
  - All math work must be neat, completed in pencil, all work shown, and be labeled appropriately
- Social Studies
  - o American history from Pre-Revolutionary War to Industrialism
  - U.S. Geography including location, capital, and abbreviations for each state (studied by region)
  - Economics
  - State report after first of year, will be taught in class
- Science
  - Life science Cells, Body Systems; Solar System; Forces; Electricity
  - Science demonstrations/labs

#### **General Reminders for Student Success**

- Always answer questions by restating the question in the response
- Write in complete sentences in cursive with correct spelling and punctuation
- Proper heading on every paper
- Keep focused as we have a fast tempo in the classroom
- Complete and turn in all assigned work on time
- Personal responsibility is the name of the game!
