## $5^{\text {th }}$ Grade Second Quarter Book Report

For the second quarter book report, students will choose a historical fiction book from the Recommended Reading List that is centered around a historical event. A book from a series such as Little House on the Prairie would not be a good choice as it focuses more on the setting than an actual event. It will also include a presentation with a visual aid. The visual aid should help guide the presentation and may be in the form of a PowerPoint (student must speak), diorama, poster, puppet show, scrapbook, or any other idea approved by the teacher. Students must get approval from a parent before teacher approval is given, to ensure that necessary items may be obtained. The teacher will provide the laptop/projector for PowerPoint presentations so students should either email the presentation to the teacher or bring it on a flash drive. The presentation and visual aid will be due on each individual student's assigned day, the week of $12 / 18$, not on the day of the written report. Students will choose their presentation day on a first come, first serve basis when the presentation approval form is turned in. Presentation approvals will be accepted beginning (not before) Thursday, 12/7.

## Q2 Book Report Rubric - Historical Fiction

This book report is a brief summary of the plot, not a retelling of the entire story! Paragraphs should be just long enough to include the necessary information, but should avoid getting too detailed. This report may be typed (Arial, 12 point, 1.5 spacing).

## Part I: The Introduction (1 paragraph, 3-5 sentences)

This paragraph should include the following and be 3 to 5 sentences in length.

- Book title and author's name $\qquad$/3
- Description of the setting (time and place)
- BRIEF introduction/description of the main character(s)

ALL characters mentioned in your report should be introduced here./6

- Type of fiction (i.e. fantasy, adventure, mystery, suspense, historical, science, etc.) ___ 3
- Point of view (i.e. first person or third person) /2
- Theme (moral/underlying message)


## Part II: The Body (3 paragraphs, 5-8 sentences each)

The body of the book report summarizes the story and gives highlights of the plot.

## Please keep your information relevant, avoiding too much detail.
