

5th Grade Second Quarter Book Report

For the second quarter book report, students will choose a **historical fiction** book from the Recommended Reading List that is **centered around a historical event**. A book from a series such as *Little House on the Prairie* would **not** be a good choice as it focuses more on the setting than an actual event. It will also include a presentation with a visual aid. The visual aid should help guide the presentation and may be in the form of a PowerPoint (student must speak), diorama, poster, puppet show, scrapbook, or any other idea approved by the teacher. Students must get approval from a parent before teacher approval is given, to ensure that necessary items may be obtained. The teacher will provide the laptop/projector for PowerPoint presentations so students should either email the presentation to the teacher or bring it on a flash drive. The presentation and visual aid will be due on each individual student's assigned day, the week of 12/18, not on the day of the written report. Students will choose their presentation day on a first come, first serve basis when the presentation approval form is turned in. Presentation approvals will be accepted beginning (not before) Thursday, 12/7.

This paragraph should include the following and be 3 to 5 sentences in length.

- Book title and author’s name _____/3
- Description of the setting (time and place) _____/4
- BRIEF introduction/description of the main character(s)
ALL characters mentioned in your report should be introduced here. _____/6
- Type of fiction (i.e. fantasy, adventure, mystery, suspense, historical, science, etc.) _____/3
- Point of view (i.e. first person or third person) _____/2
- Theme (moral/underlying message) _____/2

Part II: The Body (3 paragraphs, 5-8 sentences each)

The body of the book report summarizes the story and gives highlights of the plot.

Please keep your information relevant, avoiding too much detail.

- Body Paragraph 2 – Climax of the Plot _____/10
What is the point of highest emotion/tension?
What is the turning point of the story?

Part III: The Conclusion (1 paragraph, 5-8 sentences)

What did you learn about history? Please write a topic sentence and give at least 3 examples of content that you learned from reading your book. You may use 1st person in this paragraph. _____/10

 - When did it happen?
 - What content did you learn?
